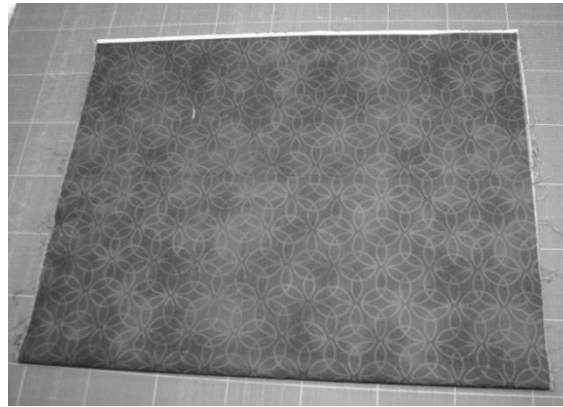


How to Square up Your Fabric

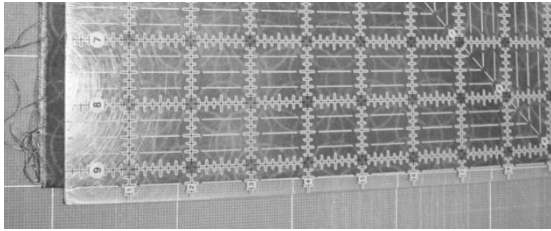


Step 1
Fold fabric in half
selvage to selvage.

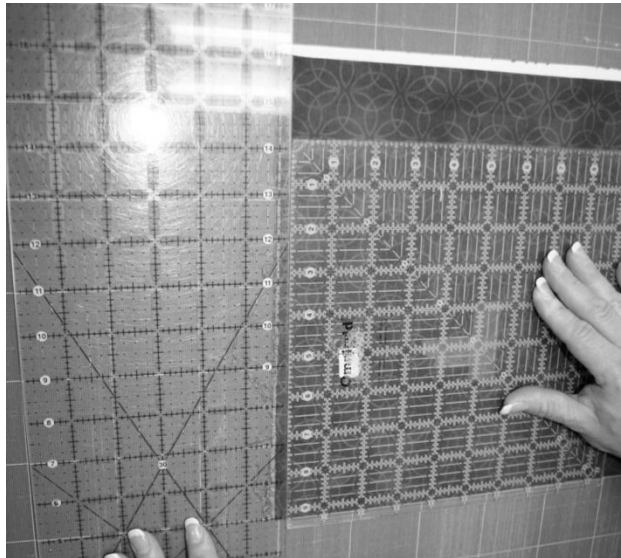
If squaring up fat
quarter, fold cut
edge to selvage.



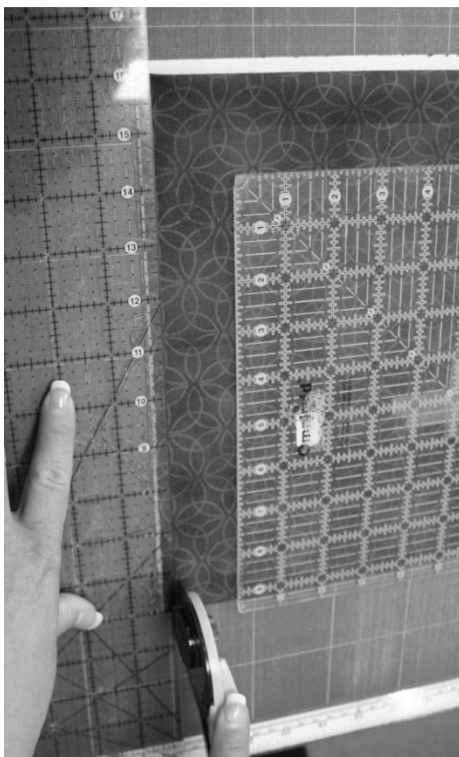
Step 2
Fold fabric again
from fold to
selvage so you
have a
manageable
piece to square
up.



Step 3
Line up the square ruler on the bottom edge
of folded fabric lining up straight line ruler
markings to your edge of fabric.



Step 4
Place long ruler
against your square
ruler (do not allow
square ruler to shift
or move in this
process.)



Step 5
Take square ruler away and trim
excess fabric using your long ruler.
This process insures that your fabric
will be square when you are cutting
strips and will eliminate the bump or
wave in your strip of fabric.

Make sure to repeat this process if
you are cutting many strips as your
fabric may shift when moving it.
